


Every Tuesday morning St E's provides bars of soap, toilet paper, laundry sheets, feminine products and adult briefs to our neighbors.


Diapers, linens and blankets, kitchen wares and dental products are offered once a month.


Coats, boots, hats & gloves are distributed in late fall and winter months.
